Resolution #6 - Sudbury & Manitoulin SCIAs - Compensation for Wildlife

- WHEREAS Crop losses from wildlife damage are substantial (OFA survey), and;
- **WHEREAS** The losses are not adequately addressed through Agricorp Production Insurance, and;
- WHEREAS Other provinces, notably Manitoba and Saskatchewan, have compensation programs for crop losses from wildlife (as previously presented by representatives from MB and SK to the Agriculture-Wildlife Conflict Working Group (AWCWG), chaired by OMAFRA), and;
- WHEREAS Ontario has a compensation program for livestock losses caused by wildlife (the Ontario Wildlife Damage Compensation Program (OWDCP), administered by OMAFRA)
- **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** OSCIA support OMAFRA, with ideas, information and statistics, in the creation of a compensation program for damage to crops by wildlife.
